



Humanistic Studies - Special prizes

- **Criteria and weighting**

The criteria for prioritising applications will be based on the tangible results achieved during the doctoral degree, which will be reflected in publications in journals, books or the proceedings of national and international conferences, in papers presented at conferences or scientific meetings, in periods spent with research groups, in the receipt of European or international distinctions, in the receipt of competitive grants, in participation research groups and other merits.

Scientific production related to the thesis (up to 60 points)

- Publications in indexed journals (up to 25 points)
- Publications in unindexed journals (up to 15 points)
- Book chapters (excluding conference proceedings) (up to 8 points)
- Publications in the proceedings of national conferences (up to 7 points)
- Publications in the proceedings of international conferences (up to 5 points)

Other merits: papers, participation in research projects, grants, teaching (university and non-university), training (up to 40 points)

- Teaching and research staff training grants (up to 10 points)
- Periods spent at research centre (up to 7 points)
- Participation in research projects (up to 9 points)
- European or international distinctions (up to 4 points)
- Papers at international conferences (up to 5 points)
- Papers at national conferences (up to 2 points)
- Prizes (up to 3 points)

- **Required complementary documentation**

Applications must be accompanied by a curriculum vitae that is presented using the template provided and that lists the candidate's merits, and by the accrediting documentation.
