



Nutrition and Metabolism - Special prizes

- **Criteria and weighting**
 - Thesis with European or international distinction (20%).
 - Quality of publications deriving from thesis where the candidate is the first author (70%).
 - Grants obtained by the candidate during the predoctoral period (5%).
 - Merits relating to innovative nature of the thesis subject, techniques employed by the candidate, difficulties overcome during the research, etc. These merits will be evaluated during a 15 minute interview. Candidates will be informed in advance so that they can prepare a presentation in which they highlight the merits that they believe make them worth of a special prize (5%).

- **Required complementary documentation**
 - Curriculum vitae
 - Accreditation of European or international distinction for thesis.
 - Copy of the first page of each of the publications deriving from the thesis in which the candidate is the first author.
 - If the article has been accepted for publication, the candidate must present the letter of acceptance from the journal and the manuscript that was submitted.
 - For publications at conferences, the candidate must present a copy of the abstract.
 - List of publications deriving from the thesis where the candidate is the first author, specifying the following for each publication:
 - Journal: order of authorship, title, journal, year of publication, quartile and ambit, impact index of the year of publication, article/review, number of citations and ISSN.
 - Book or book chapter: authors in order of signature, title, publisher, year, ISSN.
 - Patent: Inventors in order of authorship, number of application, priority country, priority date, ownership, countries in which the patent has been established.
 - Conferences: authors in order of signature, title, type of contribution (poster, oral presentation, etc.) conference, publication, place, year, organising institution.
 - List and accreditation of grants obtained by the candidate during the predoctoral period, specifying the following for each grant: Purpose of funding, funding entity, duration and institution
